Emergency Call for Medical Aid

- When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends to him/her.
- Remaining Dancers join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
- 3. Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arch.
- 4. On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an emergency call for aid.

Note: If you send for medical help or an ambulance, be sure to put a "spotter" outside the building to help them find the location where they are needed.

Please advise me if your info (club contact, dance day/time) in The Modern Square or on the ASSDF website, is wrong; as I can't fix it if I'm not told.

Most of the special dance photos are from club Facebook groups, although not everyone is on Facebook. If nothing's sent in or posted, nothing's published in The Modern Square, or on the ASSDF website. There's no word limit on club reports, but minor editing is done for typos, grammar, and continuity. The issue publication deadline is 3pm, US Central Time, on the Sunday, after the last Saturday of the month, before the month of issue.

If emails to you are returned, due to your box being full/over quota, or the address isn't valid, you won't receive notices on Modern Square releases or ASSDF club updates, until you contact me with updated info. Please let me know if you no longer want these emails.

Please CALL BEFORE TRAVELING, in case of last minute changes or cancellations. If you've been ill, feel ill on a dance night, or if weather is an issue, please stay home.

NONE of the ASSDF Officers will EVER send emails, Facebook messages, etc., asking for money, gift cards, etc.; those are SCAMS! Clubs with Facebook pages MUST police them, as scammers are posting things like "club T-Shirts", "death of a celebrity", "deleting all inactive members", "wanting part time work," (NOTHING to do with square dancing). These posts/emails have viruses to steal your identity, delete, destroy, or encrypt your data, where you'd have to pay a HUGE cost to get it back.

If you see these emails, DELETE them. And, if you see these ads, DON'T click on ANY part of them. Instead, report them to the group administrators, so the post can be deleted, and the poster can be banned from the group. Then, BLOCK that person in your email spam filter, and your Facebook profile. This helps keep that spam off your page. If not, someone will get their identity/data stolen, your Facebook page could get hacked, or you could be "left on the hook, financially".



Take the Leary Exit (Exit 213) and go south on FM 2253. At the Highway 82 intersection, turn east (left) on Highway 82. Go approximately 2 ½ miles and turn south (right) on FM 2148. Go approximately 2 miles and turn east (left) on County Road 1224A (Goldfinch). Pass Cardinal Lane and take the next driveway north (left). Follow the drive to the last shop on the right. (The driveway to the shop is off County Road 1224A or Goldfinch.)

Hi! We are the **ARKY CLOGGERS**, and we are **happy** to be the newest member of the **Arkansas State Square Dance Federation**.

Many years ago, the terms clogging and square dancing were interchangeable. Over the years the activity has morphed into two distinct groups. Luckily for the **ARKY CLOGGERS**, there are some "hybrid" dancers that love to do both! (Kim Fox, Ellen Lewis, Karen Graves, Kim Deane) Lanita Hammett is also a "hybrid" dancer, who became the director of the clogging team that started in January of 2024. 





Weather and road construction information for Shreveport

Besides event schedules, hotel and travel information for the 74 National Square Dance Convention®, two other items of interest when making plans include weather and road construction updates.

WEATHER INFORMATION

Historical weather forecast for Shreveport, LA in June records average daily high temperatures of 87-91 degrees with daily low temperatures from 69-74 degrees. According to WeatherSpark.com, the daily chance of rain in June averages about 34 percent. Rainfall is often convective and brief. Thunderstorms occur most often in spring and summer months, with severe storms most frequently in spring. The National Weather Service states the summer months are consistently quite warm and humid, and any tropical cyclones are usually in the dissipating stages by the time they reach the Shreveport area, although rainfall accompanying these systems can be heavy at times.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Interstate-20 is undergoing a major rehabilitation project in Bossier and Caddo Parishes. This section of interstate services 70,000-100,000 vehicles per day. The project is in Phase 3 and the right lane will be closed in both directions to allow for new outside lanes and shoulders. This phase of construction will include reconstruction of one or more interchanges, according to the Louisiana.gov and the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development. However, no two interchanges located next to each other will be closed at the same time.

74th NSDC Planner: review safety, emergency information

General Chairman Ted Hofmeister and Vice Chairman for Security and First Aid Larry Leavitt have prepared a quick overview of safety and health information for attendees of the 74th National Square Dance Convention® to be held June 25-28, 2025 in the Shreveport Convention Center (SCC). Review the safety reminders, and keep the following list of health contacts for reference.

•Bag searches and wanding - Bag searches will be conducted by the convention center's uniformed security staff. Leave your bags in your room or carry a clear bag to expedite the process. Allow extra time for searches when arriving for events. Additional personnel will be on hand during the NSDC to aid with bag checks. Everyone entering the building will be wanded.

•Entrances – Due to security, there will be two primary entrances to the Shreveport Convention Center. One can enter at the main entrance at 400 Caddo St. on Level 1 and at the skybridge from the attached parking deck to the center on Level 2.

•<u>No-carry zone</u> – Louisiana is an open-carry state, but there are exceptions, including the Shreveport Convention Center. Even if you have a concealed carry permit, guns are <u>not</u> allowed in the SCC. If you do travel with a weapon, have a secure place to store your gun outside the SCC.

•Prohibited items in Convention Center - The SCC security staff may refuse entry to patrons or eject them for possession of prohibited items and or violations of building policy. Prohibited items include, but are not limited to, weapons of any type, illegal drugs, fireworks, laser pointers, e-cigarettes/vapes (prohibited use inside facility), helium balloons, unauthorized noise makers, pets, drones, skates/skateboards, segways/hoverboards, coolers, glass containers, outside food and beverages. Pocket knives and scissors will not be allowed. Scissors will be available in Sew and Save on Level 2 for any repairs.

•<u>Minor first aid assistance</u> - A First Aid Station will be located inside the Shreveport Convention Center on the first floor in the main lobby at the west wall for non-emergency assistance. The First Aid Station will be open any time dancers are in the convention center and supervised by volunteers with Band Aids, antibacterial ointment, etc. Individual packets of aspirin, ibuprofen, antacids and basic supplies for self-medication will be available for purchase.

•Serious medical emergency – Call 9-1-1 and then find NSDC security officers or convention staff. A medical office will be located during the convention near the back loading dock.

•In case of a medical incident - If you have a fall, medical need or other incident, make sure to fill out a report for your protection, even if you feel the incident or injury is minor. A report may be needed by your insurance company, especially if you develop problems later. This is for your protection.

•In case of fire or evacuation - An announcement will be made from the SCC's Security or Headquarters in case of any evacuation advising everyone to proceed to the nearest exit. Emergency exits are clearly marked. Do not use elevators for emergency exits. SCC personnel will be placed on all concourse levels to assist in directing and helping individuals. Unless announced otherwise, attendees will be asked to report to the grassy lot in front of the RSA Tower near the railroad tracks at the corner of Water and Dauphin streets. Personnel will also be on hand outside to provide directions.

•<u>Weather-related emergency</u> – In case of a weather emergency, the SCC's Security and Headquarters will decide upon the appropriate action based on the weather warning. Security and SCC Staff will be placed on all levels to direct patrons to safety until an "all clear" is issued. •Important documents – Documents you might consider bringing with you to the NSDC include your identification, insurance card, list of current medications and allergies, medical history and contact person(s). Make sure someone in your travel group knows where to find your information in case of emergency.

Emergency call for medical aid on the dance floor

If you or another dancer fall ill during a square dance and cannot get off the dance floor, the following steps can help summon aid quicker and reduce the risk of further serious injury.

1. When a dancer goes down, one other dancer in the square will attend to the injured dancer.

The other dancers will back up in a circle to give the injured and the attending dancer room and air.

3. The circled dancers will lift their hands into an arch, known as the Emergency Call for Medical Aid (ECMA) formation.

4. Upon seeing this, the caller or hall monitor will place an ECMA to summon a first responder. If this does not occur, a dancer should hurry to the stage to alert the caller, or those in charge, so the proper authorities can be summoned as quickly as possible.

If you suddenly feel nauseated, etc. get out of the square and to a restroom as fast as possible. Your fellow dancers will understand. Although we do not like to think about it, everyone needs to be prepared to deal with an emergency situation, should one develop.

Please remember the convention center is also a no-carry zone. Any weapons will be confiscated. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

Convention veterans provide packing and arrival tips

It's your first time to attend the National Square Dance Convention[®], you've registered, made your hotel and travel arrangements, but what do you do now? Bonnie Koryiak-Anderson – You can also put your petticoat in a pillowcase, but if flying shrink wrap is super smart!

Bobby Parker, Kurly Q's, Odenville, AL – Comfortable shoes, go straight to registration table find your alphabet and get your badges! Check everything on your badge to make sure it's correct. I also agree with everything else that has been mentioned. Pace yourself on the dancing and enjoy all the tours you can! It's a vacation on steroids!

Sandi Silva – I suggest you purchase ahead of time the program book that comes with the small pocket size daily schedules. They are printed by basically from the long form orders on that item, very few are left over to be purchased at the registration table. Get a long form and pre-purchase it, so handy to have the small daily as they are not sold separately but with the large program book. Pre-order to be safe. Hope to meet you at the Registration table – see you then and say "hi."

Mary Ann Howard – Band-Aids, cool clothes and please have an emergency number and directions if not with family. Also have a way to carry items you may need as you do not want to sit a purse down to dance.

DeDe Denise Howard, Oklahoma – Before you go: Comfortable shoes are number one! Comfortable clothes are second! Dressy clothes for evening dancing if you wish. You are going to walk and or dance a lot, so comfort is important. A small backpack or bag to carry shoes



changes or other items. Pack little shareable stickers or dangles or other cute nicknacks from your home state to give to your new friends in your squares, you may find some that like to trade you for them. We also like to carry business cards with our local club information to give out. Make sure to have a camera or room on your phone for pictures. Please order your program book ahead of time. It will come in very handy to plan out a schedule for all the activities, so you don't miss anything. It will also help so you don't get over tired. Once you are there: After stopping at the registration center get your badges and pick up your program book. Check out the location for the halls with levels of dance you want to do. Mark off the times for any of the exhibitions that you want to watch. Check out some of the different activities that might not be available in your area such as hex dancing or maybe round dancing, or etc. Plan some time to check out the city you are in also, as that helps support our conventions. Don't forget to smile and have fun. Strike up a conversation with your new friends or callers.

John Harden – Bring cash and credit cards. There will be things you want... anything from square dance clothes and dance shoes (and often sale and clearance items with the vendors that can save a pretty penny) to badges and dangles, accessories (both useful and fun) to souvenirs. That first convention will be memorable like you wouldn't believe! Also, bring a notebook to collect names and contact info, a camera (I know, we all have them on our phones these days), and a calendar so that you can track things you want to do later. For ladies, I highly recommend a fanny pack or waist pouch, something that will move comfortably with you and stay close during vigorous dancing! Finally, bring your sense of adventure... you will have a blast!

Cathy Kaiser, I'm from Helena, MT, Helena Last Chance Squares - We brought casual skirts, shorts for daytime and good walking shoes because the facility we went to for USA West could not handle the meals for all that stayed there so we walked for our meals.

Elizabeth Johnson Nolen, Kurly Q's & Gadsden Twirlers, Alabama – Lots of good information already posted, I'd like to add: Epsom salts (for soaking feet and body), super glue, eye glass repair kit, band aids, sunscreen and bug repellent if tours take you outdoors.

ONCE YOU ARRIVE IN SHREVEPORT

There are several transportation options to get you to and from the Shreveport Regional Airport, as well as around the Shreveport-Bossier City area June 25-28, 2025 while at the 74th National Square Dance Convention[®] in the Shreveport Convention Center (SCC).

The convention's Shreveport Hilton Downtown has a shuttle service available for registered guests. When you arrive at the regional airport, you should call (318) 698-0900 for shuttle service. If shuttle service is not immediately available, you have options of Uber, Lyft and local taxis.

No other hotel offers shuttle services at this time.

Uber and Lyft are both phone apps that you download and then use to order service. Rides normally cost between \$20-\$30. They are an option if you don't have your personal vehicle. Shreveport Yellow Checker Cab (the only taxi company) is located right outside the regional airport doors. They are available 24/7 and run between \$23-\$35, depending on your destination. If you need to call a taxi to get around while you are at the convention, the number is (318) 425-7000.

Shreveport also operates public bus transportation. All SporTran and SporTran OnDemand services are free through 2025 within the Shreveport-Bossier City limits. OnDemand service is for ADA and mobility riders. To access schedules and maps, go to <u>www.sportran.org</u>. Most daytime routes run from 5:45 a.m. until 5:45 p.m. Nighttime routes are not the same as day routes so make sure to check schedules. For information, call (318) 221-RIDE (7433) between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

PARKING DETAILS

If you are driving a rental car or your personal vehicle, parking is available in the multi-level Shreveport Convention Center Garage attached to the SCC via an elevated, covered walkway for \$4 per day (with in/out privileges). The SCC garage is located at 198 Market St. There are other parking garages nearby with various rates. Be aware there is a limited height restriction of 7 feet. Additional pay-as-you-go outside parking lots are also in the vicinity. If you are staying at Sam's Town Hotel & Casino, they have 1,200 free parking spaces.

Wondering how you can make purchases in the Shreveport Convention Center?

We've got the information for you!

• The Shreveport Convention Center (SCC) accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover cards for food and the attached parking garage. If you do not have a credit or debit card, you can buy Visa, MasterCard or American Express gift cards in advance.

• Convention concessions will have at least one register that will accept cash, in addition to credit/debit cards.

 The SCC also accepts Tap-to-Pay options from smart phones, if you have it enabled on your phone and/or credit card.

 The 74th NSDC Vendors and Ways & Means will be able to accept both cash or credit/debit cards for your convenience.

• The chargeFuze electronic device charging kiosks inside the convention center accept payment via the chargeFuze app on your mobile device. Some stations may allow you to initiate rental of a portable charging device by inserting any major payment card.

 <u>Cash tip</u>: Remember to bring a little more cash than you might expect to use. For example, if you plan to attend the KICK START Dance on Tuesday, June 24 in the Shreveport Convention Center from 8-10 p.m. there is a \$15 per person entry fee. This special dance features national callers Tony Oxendine, Jack Pladdys, Jet Roberts and Ted Lizotte. You may need additional cash for various sundries you had not considered during the convention, so be prepared.

74th NSDC Planner: Basic facilities

The 74th National Square Dance Convention[®] will be held June 25-28, 2025 at the Shreveport Convention Center. You can register online at <u>www.74thNSDC.com</u> until June 20, or there is a Registration Long Form included in this issue of *National Squares* to print, fill out, and mail in until June 10. You must submit a Registration Long Form in order for your registration to be finalized. The Registration Long Form is the one on which you indicate your lodging and order convention materials. Below is basic information for planning purposes. Refer to the 74th NSDC's daily schedules or mobile app for the most up-to-date information.

CONVENTION CENTER: The state-of-the-art Shreveport Convention Center, located at 400 Caddo St. in Shreveport, LA, includes more than 350,000 square feet of multipurpose meeting space. The adjacent 4-story parking garage, with 800 spaces, is connected to the center via an elevated, covered walkway. The convention center complex includes a marshalling yard and exhibitor parking.

AREA PARKING: Parking at the multi-level garage attached to the convention center is \$4 per day (with in/out privileges). There are 800 parking spaces, be aware the parking gates do not accept cash so you will need a debit or credit card. There are several parking garages in the vicinity of the convention center. There is a limited height restriction of 7 feet. There are also some pay-as-you-go outside parking lots in the area.

ON-SITE DINING: The Shreveport Convention Center has prepared numerous meal options and two concession areas for your convenience. The concession areas are located on Level 1 in the back of the primary dance/exhibit halls. There will be alternate dining locations on both levels of the convention center. In addition, the Coffee Talk Café, which includes favorites from Starbucks, is located in the lobby between the convention center and the Hilton Shreveport Hotel, which will provide dining opportunities at Market 104 and River & Rye.

REGISTRATION PACKET PICK-UP LOCATION: Dancer registration packet pickup and tours information will be located on the first floor of the Shreveport Convention Center in the Pre-Function Area (Lobby) adjacent to Caddo Street. Signs will direct you to the Registration area.

DANCE HALLS: We will have 10 primary dance halls. Be aware some halls may be used as limited multiuse areas so check your schedules upon arrival at the convention. Refer to the convention center's "Spaces" map in this edition for locations.

<u>CONVENTION ACTIVITIES:</u> All dancing, education rooms, vendors, Showcase of Ideas and 74th NSDC events will be in the Shreveport Convention Center, with the exception of campground activities, tours and the GSI Callers School. Our auditorium will be in Exhibit Hall 2 on Level 1, which will be the location of the opening and closing ceremonies, fashion show, bid session, USDA meeting on Wednesday, the organizational roundtable, keynote speaker, exhibitions and clogging. The Wednesday night special event with comedian and TV host Dennis Swanberg will also be in the auditorium in Exhibit Hall 2 on Level 1. The Cajun Dinner on Wednesday night for those who purchase tickets will be upstairs on Level 2. The Ghost Riders Square Dance Band will be performing live in Exhibit Hall 3 on Level 1. The GSI Callers School will be located at Sam's Town.


<u>GETTING AROUND</u>: Public transit is available as well as taxi and ride share options such as Lyft and Uber. There will be on-site food concessions and there are several restaurant options within walking distance of the SCC. See related information on public transit in this edition.

GETTING HERE: Shreveport and its sister city of Bossier City are part of the Ark-La-Tex area in the northwest corner of Louisiana. Shreveport is approximately 30 miles from both Texas and Arkansas and is located at the intersection of Interstate-20 and I-49 for easy car travel. The mid-sized Shreveport Regional Airport, which is 7.4 miles from the convention center, is serviced by American, Delta and United Airlines. Be aware no airport shuttle services are provided, except to the Shreveport Hilton. One might also consider flying into Dallas, headquarters for Southwest Airlines. One can travel from Dallas to Shreveport via rental car or Amtrak. The Shreveport Intermodal Terminal is 1.6 miles by taxi or ride-share such as Uber to the convention center, Hilton Shreveport and Sam's Town. The Amtrak Texas Eagle does not travel all the way to Shreveport. You disembark in Longview, TX, and an Amtrak motorcoach drives you from Longview to Shreveport at no additional cost. There is only one train per day either direction so make air reservations accordingly.

TOURS: To view convention tour options, go to <u>www.74NSDC.com/tours</u>. One can click the button "Join Us" located underneath the brochure to go to reservations, or use the direct link: <u>https://74nsdc.cloudreg.us</u>. For more information, email <u>Tours74NSDC@gmail.com</u>. One can also visit the Tours Booth during the convention to check on availability.

HOTELS: Make sure to book your hotel through the convention to get the special convention rate. Once you complete a Registration Long Form, you will receive a link to finalize your lodging. Please complete your lodging reservation as soon as possible in order to receive special convention rates. Links to hotels are included in this edition. Be aware the Hilton Shreveport Hotel is "sold out" with a waitlist and is the only hotel attached to the convention center. There are six other area hotels offering special convention rates. Sam's Town, about a 10-minute walk from the convention center, is the official caller and cuer hotel. Rates are \$115 Sunday-Thursday and \$145 for Friday-Saturday nights. The Holiday Inn Shreveport, located 0.7 miles from the convention center, is \$115 per night as is the Holiday Inn Express. A short 6-minute drive away are the Hampton Inn and the Hilton Garden Inn, both in Bossier City at a rate of \$139, and Homewood Suites, also in Bossier City, at \$169. See hotel links elsewhere in this edition.

RV AND CAMPING: Camping accommodations are available at the State Fairgrounds of Louisiana, located at 3701 Hudson St. in Shreveport. Each site is roughly the same site with full hookups, including water and sewer with 30 or 50-amp connections. The 200-site campground is 4.6 miles from the convention. There is currently no bus shuttle service to the convention center. Parking is available at the convention center for \$4 per day (in/out). There is a height restriction of 7 feet. The 74th NSDC has rented the campground's air-conditioned hospitality building for our NSDC campers to have a place to meet, socialize and for nightly After Parties. There will be a message board inside the hospitality building to arrange for carpooling, if desired, and for posting general information.



Hearing Assistance Devices available at 74th NSDC

Would you benefit from a Hearing Assistance Device? Here's how they work. A transmitter is placed on the caller/cuer stage in each dance hall. You wear an FM receiver that has the capability of changing channel frequencies and there is an earpiece that plugs into the receiver you are wearing. You control the volume. There is no background noise, just the caller or cuer's voice.

These devices are available for free during the 74th NSDC with a \$50 required REFUNDABLE deposit. You can pre-order your reservation for a Hearing Assistance Device using the Registration Long Form. The devices will then be available for pick up in the Ways and Means area at the convention. There will be signage at the convention directing you to Ways and Means. The deposit will be refunded back to you upon return of the device. *However, be aware there are very limited number still remaining.* To check on availability, contact Cheryl Rush at peppercatt2@gmail.com.

As an option, if you would like to have your own personal device, we will have brand new in-the-box units for purchase for approximately \$25 each. The device would be yours to keep, and it would work with any hearing assist broadcast that uses an FM signal, which most do. To inquire, stop by the 74th NSDC Ways and Means table during the convention.

Convention Center

Stay powered up at the 74th NSDC

Make sure you stay connected while at the 74th National Square Dance Convention[®]. Battery running low on your cell phone or other devices? The Shreveport Convention Center has self-service charging kiosks powered by chargeFUZE located throughout the facility for your convenience.

Each station has approximately 45 portable chargers available with micro-USB, USB-C, and Lightning cables compatible with all iPhones, Androids, tablets, select laptops and headphones. A rental fee does apply. Most devices should fully charge in an hour or less. The kiosks can be easily seen in the convention center's hallways, but one can download the chargeFUZE App to quickly locate a charging station within the convention center.

How does it work?

1. Use your device to scan the chargeFUZE kiosk's QR Code, follow the easy instructions to eject a portable charger.

2. Charge your device on the go. The rental rate is \$2 per 30 minutes up to \$40 max.

3. After charging, return the charger to any chargeFUZE station in the convention center.



There are portable chargers available from kiosks in the Shreveport Convention Center like the one above for a small fee. You can charge your cell phone and other devices on the go and return the charger to any of the chargeFUZE kiosks throughout the convention center.



How do I find dance schedules?



The 74th NSDC Program Book will contain valuable information related to the Shreveport convention and will make a great souvenir. Included with your purchase of the Program Book will be the pocket-sized Dailies. Have you ever wondered how to find the National Square Dance Convention[®] schedule? What is the Program Book, Daily Schedule booklets and the Mobile App? What is the difference?

Program Book

The Program Book has dance leader and education presenter profiles, information about the NSDC committee as well as the convention center, upcoming convention promotions, and lots of advertisements and great information. You can look up that inspirational leader, someone to book for dances and where to find dance halls, vendors and food. The Program Book is a wonderful souvenir to remind you of a fantastic NSDC.

Order Program Books through the 74th NSDC's website soon to ensure yours is reserved. There will be a very limited number available at convention. Visit: <u>https://www.74nsdc.com/registeronline</u>. Program Books and Daily Schedules booklets are only available at convention when you register.

Dailies

the pocket-sized Dailies. You can find dance leader and education presenter schedules in the Daily Schedule booklets, known as the Dailies. There are three booklets: Wednesday and Thursday are combined with separate booklets for Friday and Saturday. The Dailies schedules

are current when they are printed. These are a handy size to put into your bag or pocket. The Dailies can only be purchased with the Program Book.

Don't forget that schedules, often changed daily, will be posted outside all dance halls and education rooms.

Mobile App

Another great way to keep up with schedules and information is with the convention's Mobile Application, otherwise known as App. You can find your favorite callers, events like Last Square Standing, Exhibitions and the Keynote Address, as well as addresses for drug stores, groceries, churches, and restaurants. You can "star" the events you want to attend, and the App will keep track of your preferred schedule. Another positive feature is that the App is updated constantly since it is linked to the up-tothe-minute scheduling computer system.

The mobile App <u>will be available toward the end of June</u> and announced on social media and our website. You will not be able to buy the App on our website. The App will only be available through the Apple App Store

or Google Play Store. Once in the store: search 74th NSDC, make sure there is a space between "th" and NSDC (ex. 74th NSDC).

Remember, an announcement will be made once the mobile App is available. In the meantime, make sure to order your souvenir Program Book with Dailies!

Show your colors at the 74th NSDC

The official colors of the 74th NSDC are royal blue and bright yellow, which are the colors of the convention's state host – the Louisiana Square Dance Association. The mascot for the Shreveport convention is the alligator (Pa and Ma, Allie, 'Gator and all the cousins).



Bring your alligator bling and accessories and wear some royal blue and yellow if you've got it (not required)!

Convention attire

Suggested attire: Casual clothing allowed up to 6 p.m. Square dance attire (or dance clothing appropriate for activity) requested, but not required, after 6 p.m. for evening dances. A 74th NSDC badge is required to enter all convention activities.

Ethics and etiquette

Treat everyone in your square with courtesy, be friendly and helpful. Avoid actions to make anyone else in your square uncomfortable. Refrain from criticism, if it is necessary make sure it is constructive. Help less experienced dancers, if needed. Dance gently, don't use

s experienced dancers, if needed. Dance gently, don't use _ an excessive grip or jerk/push others through the square.

Communicate, advise your partner if you have an injury or impairment that may impact your ability to twirl, etc.

Observe personal hygiene and cleanliness. Be sure to use deodorant and colognes in moderation. Remember too much cologne may trigger an allergic reaction for someone else,

Avoid alcoholic beverages before and during dances. No alcohol is allowed in the Shreveport Convention Center. Dancing requires your best mental and physical alertness.

If possible, enter the dance floor with a partner. If you need a partner, it is acceptable to stand at the edge of the floor and hold one hand in the air indicating that you are ready to dance. Join the first square you come to. Walk around the outside of the square to the nearest open position.

If no squares are available to join and you wish to create a new square, raise your hand displaying the



If forming a new square, it is customary to raise the number of fingers to indicate how many couples are needed to complete the square.

number of couples needed by an equal number of fingers. The caller should see your upraised hand and encourage others to complete the square. If a square is not full and no one has their hand up, it generally indicates they are waiting on a couple who has already promised to dance with them.

Do not leave a square in the middle of a dance. It is impolite to other members of the square if you leave before the tip ends. If you become ill and must make an exit, advise the other dancers in your square of your departure. If you have an emergency, everyone should understand.

If your square breaks down, go to home position, form lines, and continue. Be helpful. Point to where someone should be if they are in the wrong spot. Remember if you must correct, do so with a smile.

Never cross the floor while others are dancing. If you need to move to the other side of the room, quietly walk around the perimeter.

If you are not on the dance floor, keep conversations to a low volume so those on the dance floor can hear the caller or cuer.

At the end of the tip, applaud the caller and thank everyone in the square. Other methods of dance follow similar rules of etiquette.

At the NSDC, you are here not only to have fun but to ensure those around you do as well. Be courteous and observe the Golden Rule – "do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Square dancers have a reputation for being some of the friendliest people around and, remember, the attire is one thing that helps distinguish the dancers and dance leaders from the general public. You are encouraged, but not required, to dress the part, wave and say hello, and brighten up the streets and convention center of Shreveport.

Get a square together for the exciting Last Square Standing Competition at the 74th NSDC in Shreveport, LA! HERE'S THE COMPETITION SQUARES RULES:

- 1. All individuals of the group (each square) must be registered for the 74th National Square Dance Convention[®] and wear an official convention badge.
- 2. A Competition Registration Form can be picked up at the Dance Leader Coordination Room on Level 1 in Exhibit Hall 3 (Variety Hall) where the competition will take place one hour before the competition begins. Each group must submit a completed form prior to competition start.
- 3. The Competition Registration Form will require the name of the group, the name of the group leader, the names of the eight dancers, and the name of the 9th person to serve as an Event Judge.
- 4. There will be one practice tip at 11:30 a.m. in Exhibit Hall 3. It is recommended that the group practice during the DBD sessions. Please refer to the daily schedule in case of any change in location and time.
- 5. The competition will be called at the Mainstream program according to the CALLERLAB list.
- 6. The contest will consist of two parts. The first heat will be a timed event. The final heat will be judged as last man standing using a prerecorded tape.

- All contestants must check in prior to the practice tip which will begin at 11:30 a.m. in Exhibit Hall 3 (Variety Hall).
- You will not be assigned the Judge you brought. At the end of each session, the Event Judge will rotate to a new square. Your Event Judge should be impartial and is encouraged NOT to be a close friend, family member, dance partner, fellow club member, etc.
- 9. The first heat is a timed event. There will be three 10-minute sessions with a short break in between. During this session, the amount of down time will be clocked by an Event Judge. The winner will be the group with the least amount of downtime. Down time starts when the square breaks down and will end when (1) the square starts dancing again, (2) the square is in proper dance position, and (3) that sequence ends, and the dancers return to their home position. (Proper dance position will be two couple facing lines along the side walls with a beau to the left of the belle).
- 10.At the end of each session, the down time will be recorded on your team's score sheet. At the end of the heat, the group's score sheet will be submitted to the Event table. Scores will be tallied.
- 11. The number of groups moving to the final round will be determined at the start of the competition and will be dependent upon the number of submissions.
- 12. The **final heat** will be "last man standing" and will use a prerecorded tape. Each group will square up and the recorded caller will start easy and get more difficult. When a square breaks down they will be timed until they start dancing or return to proper dance position. If they are not dancing or in proper dance position for longer than 10 beats of music, they will be given a yellow card. If the square keeps dancing but does not resolve at home correctly, they will receive a yellow card. On the second breakdown they will be given a red card and eliminated from the competition.
- 13.Groups must agree to stop dancing and leave the floor if a judge gives the red card, even if you disagree with the ruling. Groups should move toward the judges table for additional instructions and for final awards.
- 14.In the event of a tie during the final heat, the team with the lowest time during the first heat will be awarded first place.

Dancers are encouraged to wear accepted square dance attire.

New education classes being offered at the 74th NSDC in Shreveport

The Education Committee for the 74th National Square Dance Convention[®] in Shreveport is excited to announce the addition of six new classes. They are:

1. <u>Emergency Intervention for a Fallen Dancer</u> - This class will discuss what the emergency interventions are for a dancer who has fallen. It will list the responsibilities of dancers, callers, and observers as well as what to do and what not to do.

2. <u>Square Dancing Around Social Media Marketing</u> - In this class on social media marketing for the square dance community, you'll learn effective strategies to build and engage an online audience, promote events, and strengthen the presence of square dancing on social platforms. You will explore platform-specific techniques for Facebook and Instagram, focusing on creating content that resonates with both seasoned dancers and newcomers. By the end of the class, you'll be equipped with the tools to grow your dance group's visibility, increase participation, and create lasting connections within the square dance community.

 <u>Exhibition Square Dancing</u> - Square dance exhibition groups flourished in the past but only a handful remain active.

This session will explore the "care and nurturing" of an exhibition dance group based on the experiences of those actively involved in two current groups: the California Heritage Dancers and the River City Riders. Leaders will share their group's purpose and focus; how the team got started; and the benefits and challenges of maintaining a successful group. The session will also discuss the process and benefits of becoming a 501(c)(3) charitable and educational organization as well as ideas for fundraising to support the group's operations and travel. The River City Riders will have a horse costume for participants to see up close.

4. <u>Starting and Maintaining a Home-School Club</u> - If you are interested in starting a square dance club for home-schooled teens and young adults this is the class for you. Matt Barnes will share how he started "H-Town Squares," a home-school based square dance club for teens and one of the largest square dance clubs in Texas as well as a club for young adults called "Market Street Squares." He will discuss recruitment and retention for both clubs as well as feedback he has received from some of his dancers as to how existing square dance clubs might attract and retain teen and young adult dancers.

5. <u>Creating a College Square Dance Club</u> - MIT has had a square dance club since 1967. In their 58 years of existence, they have had only four callers. The longest, tenured caller is their current caller, Ted Lizotte, who has been calling for the club since 1997. During this presentation, Ted will discuss the basics of how Tech Squares functions today as a club and within the confines of the college where they dance. If you've ever asked yourself if trying to get a dance club at a school or university is for you – this may be the session for you to attend.

6. <u>Competitive Square Dancing at the Huntsman World Senior Games</u> - Did you know that you are an ATHLETE and can compete at the Huntsman World Senior Games as a square dancer? It's true! In addition to one morning of competition, there are four days of square and round dancing to national callers and cuers. Competition in square dancing is OPTIONAL! In this class you will find out all about the Huntsman World Senior Games, the rules of competition, and experience what competition is like by participating in our "Competition Demo." Learn how you can win your GOLD MEDAL!
