Education & Publicity

It's time to review some of the hints that make a square dancing flow smoothly and make it less likely for a square to break down. In our rush to plus, these hints are often overlooked.

- **Proper styling** is just as important as knowing the definitions.
- Holding hands is so very important. When you have formed, say, lines of 4, immediately join the hands in the center. Even if another call is quickly called, just a brief touching of hands will reestablish the formation and keep the square under control. "Couples Promenade, don't stop; don't slow down, head couples Wheel Around". More often than not, the resulting lines of 4 will not be parallel with any of the walls. Joining hands is mandatory as this movement has a potential for disaster. If you are not parallel with a wall, the solution is for the couples on the right to take a step forward and the couples on the left to take a step back. Of course, you all have to be aware and in agreement, but this is what square dancing is all about.
- Ladies Chain The gentlemen should step aside and give the approaching lady room for a courtesy turn.
- All 4 Couples Promenade The gentlemen should almost be touching in the center. Remember that the ladies have twice as far to go and must move twice as fast just to keep up.
- Weave the Ring Keep it small and keep it moving. Don't hold up others while you bump and twirl. You can put lots of energy into a square dance, but it should still be graceful and flow smoothly.

Side bar: last month's matching puzzle.... the first person that comes to the Diamond Squares dance with the correct solution will get a year's free subscription the American Square Dance magazine or extension if you already subscribe. You do get this great magazine, don't you?

Let's continue the discussion on some things we might need to seriously consider as we now begin to accept the possibility and the responsibility that the ASSDF is on the brink of folding. It may follow that if the ASSDF does fail, it also signals that the next step would see the further decline of square dancing itself in Arkansas. Editorials and articles in the last four issues have acknowledged that likelihood unless drastic actions are taken now.

The current square dance pulse in Arkansas is not something unique. We all know that the entire nation has been experiencing the downward spiral of square dance numbers for three decades. We as the square dance community have an excellent record of ignoring the warning signs. Once vibrant, square dance clubs in Arkansas continue to fold at an alarming rate.

But ... what about the square dance caller being the real key to a revival? Two years ago I did a series of articles in this column that dealt with, what I believe to be, the four major elements of square dance — the dancer, the choreography, the music, and the caller. The first three I covered in some detail. But when it came time to discuss the caller element in depth, I shied away from the subject for fear that what I might write could in some way diminish the image of the square dance callers as being exemplary leaders of the square dance activity.

Our two professional caller organizations, Callerlab and the American Callers Association, have established standardized programs; promoted ethical practices; provided a collective and necessary voice to represent individual callers in dealing with ASCAP and BMI relative to licensing requirements. Both have now recognized that some leeway has to be allowed for callers to try innovative ways to fight the trend of declining dancers. And each has scaled down list versions to cut the time required to create a new dancer.

My problem has been that even with the suggested abbreviated lists each proposes, there is always the suggestion that some dancers may want to learn more movements. To me that implied (subliminal) message says, "Yes, more is better," Yeah, just like the beginning of the rat race to learn great lists of call that contributed to our problems in the first place.

So yes! Callers do control the dance because dancers can only dance the calls we call. And if we (callers) control the dance, we should have the skills to establish realistic goals to create a dancer in three or four months of weekly sessions of lessons.

Last month I threw this out to you. "IF EVERY caller in the land, especially members of Callerlab and American Callers Association were to decide that for one year, at EVERY DANCE that they would only call the same fifty basic movements, it would establish the most called program in the land. It would be the only thing out there to dance to. Responsible callers would adjust and do some work to make sure their use of limited call selection would be a work of calling art. Any caller worthy of the name should be able to do that anyway.

And I also said the Plus, Advanced and Challenge crowd should continue to do their thing and just stay out of our way. Of course we would have to watch'em because they would be trying to proselytize to our dancers as a basis for classes to feed their ranks.

Three years ago a shorter teaching concept was proposed as a combined effort of Callerlab and the American Callers Association. It never went anywhere because we callers considered it too tame. But let's take a fresh look at it in the context of a short list of calls that might just be what we should try as a start.

It was the *Experimental Condensed Teaching Order* (ETCO 40). A joint committee worked several months before coming up with such a teaching structure that can be **taught in 12 weekly sessions.** A list of forty line-item calls was selected to make up the total program. The concept was to have a course that would require weekly sessions for just three months. Is such a scheme possible or practical? Sure, and I will give some solid proof next time.

I knew that a committee was working to reach some consensus on the question and I knew about its announcement from the official report to Callerlab members from its website. But I never took the plan seriously until I saw the whole report again in American Square Dance magazine.

It's with that background that I ask you to look at this proposal. First let's examine the core curriculum of 12 two hour sessions:

- **Session 1:** Circle Left/Right; Promenade; Wheel Around; Dosado; Stars
- Session 2: Lead Right/Left; Right and Left Thru; Slide Thru; Pass Thru/Double Pass Thru and U-turn Back
- Session 3: Ladies in Men Sashay/ ½ Sashay' Bend the Line;
 Veer Left/Right and Trades
- Session 4: Cloverleaf; Grand Square; Alamo Style and Swing Thru
- **Session 5:** Run; Trade By and Circulates
- **Session 6:** Single Circle to a Wave; Square Thru and Wheel and Deal (out facing lines)
- Session 7: Touch 1/4/Hinge, Scoot Back and Ferris Wheel
- **Session 8:** Pass to the Center and Zoom
- **Session 9:** Pass the Ocean and Extend
- Session 10: Cast Off 3/4 and Fold/Cross Fold
- **Session 11:** Recycle and sweep 1/4
- **Session 12:** Flutter Wheel/Reverse Flutter

So there is the program in all of its glory. Is it practical? You bet it is. Next time I will give some tangible proof that it can be. We really do need to be realistic in our approach to save the ASSDF and square dance in Arkansas and in the nation.


Before traveling to a dance, call ahead first.
